



COVID19 Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. What safety protocols are in place?

Paris Figure Skating Club in guidance with Skate Canada, Skate Ontario, Federal and Provincial Governments, County of Brant and the Brant County Health Unit have developed Return to Play protocols.

Coaches, skaters, spectators, and board members must adhere to the protocols.

Q. Where do I sign the COVID19 waiver?

The COVID19 waiver is in your Uplifter account.

The parent/guardian on the account must sign the waiver before any individual is permitted on the ice.

Any volunteers must sign the waiver as well and it can be found on the Skate Ontario Covid-19 webpage

Q. Do I get screened every time I go to the arena?

Mandated by Skate Ontario, and the Province of Ontario coaches, board members, and participants and spectators must self screen for any covid19 symptoms before attending a session. If you do not pass the screening, please do not attend skating. Screening can be found at <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/>

Q. I have COVID19 Symptoms, waiting for test results or have tested positive. Now what?

Do not attend any skating sessions.

Q. If I am absent for reasons due to COVID19 will I get a refund?

PFSC has created a COVID19 cancellation and refund policy.
 It can be found in the Return to Play protocols.
 Absences not related to COVID19 will be dealt with as per PFSC cancellation/refund policy.

Q. How will I be informed if sessions are cancelled, or there are changes to sessions due to Covid19?

PFSC will notify members using Uplifter.
 Members should ensure contact information is up to date on their account.
 In addition, messages may be posted on club websites and social media accounts.

Q. Can I watch my child skate? Or can Grandma/Grandpa, etc watch my child skate?

Yes. Spectators are welcome and must follow any protocols set out by the County of Brant and our club.

Q. What cleaning and disinfectant measures will be taken?

We ask all individuals to sanitize hands upon entry and exit of the facility.
 Canskate equipment will be disinfected regularly

Q. Do I have to wear a face covering/mask?

As of March 21, 2022 face coverings are no longer required for the public to access County of Brant facilities.

At this time wearing a face covering is a personal choice, and we ask that you be kind and respectful to others.

If using the harness, coaches and skaters must still wear a mask.

Q. I am healthy, so do I have to follow these protocols?

Yes,

We are mandated by Skate Ontario to ensure we meet their protocols.

If someone is not adhering to the protocols:

Contact a member of the COVID19 oversight group and/or report the incident to a staff member of Brant Sports Complex.

Consequences for non-compliance are outlined in the PFSC Return to Play Protocols.

Q. Can coaches and/or Program Assistants (PAs) help my child get back up after they fall on the ice?

When not actively participating in skating, individuals are required to maintain a physical distance of at least 2m from any other person during the session. Individuals from the same household are not required to follow physical distancing requirements.

If any skater requires assistance for first aid, coaches will breach the 6ft/2m distance to assist. Precautions will be taken to reduce the risk of any exposure to COVID19.

Q. Will my child still be tested or assessed?

Yes, skaters will continue to be assessed, when ready.
